In 2005 he joined Germanischer Lloyd, as “Global Head of Practice - Ship Recycling” he was responsible for the development and establishment of all ship recycling services of Germanischer Lloyd (GL) in line with the Hong Kong Convention (HKC). He has created a comprehensive service portfolio for GL which can't be found in the industry elsewhere yet.

Henning has established Green Ship Recycling Services e.K. in January 2011 (now GSR Services GmbH) for supporting all stakeholders for cost effective preparations for and fulfilment of IMO's Hong Kong Convention, EU Ship Recycling regulation and other applicable requirements.

After stepping back as founding & board member of International Ship Recyclers Association (ISRA) in March 2012 he has established the “International Hazardous Material Expert Association” (IHMA e.V.) in March 2013 in Dubai, which compiles knowledge and technical expertise of leading “IHM Experts”, create a global network for offering highly qualified IHM services to the shipping industry, closing gaps in existing technical guidelines of IMO, and establish highest standards and provide guidance to all stakeholders like flag and recycling states, classification societies, P&I clubs, insurance companies and others.

## Overview on activities and projects

In addition GSR has worked on the EU-funded project “ShipDIGEST” (Ship Dismantling Insight by Generating Environmental and Safety Training) funded by the European Commission / Leonardo da Vinci program. The main aim and objective was to assist the ship recycling industry by improving, through knowledge transfer, the various identified social and HSE issues by utilising innovative products, tools and vocational education and training (VET) from previous EU projects and from similar industries within the EU.

GSR has carried out its services in various regions like Asia (e.g. China, India, Japan, Philippines, Singapore), Europe (e.g. Germany, Gibraltar, Netherlands), and Africa (e.g. Cameroun, Gabon, Namibia). Besides numerous IHM preparations for new and existing ships GSR has developed the audit system and check routines for internal audits of ship recycling facilities by ISRA. For GL and ClassNK various trainings for IHM Experts, persons who are preparing IHMs for ships, have been conducted as well as support provided for utilization of IHM in conjunction with ship recycling facility specific procedures for planning safe and environmentally sound recycling of ships (Ship Recycling Plan preparation). In addition GSR has conducted an Expert Report on “Comparison of equivalency of control mechanisms of Basel Convention with the upcoming Hong Kong Convention” on behalf of Japan Ship Center (JETRO) in London, just to name a few of our successful projects.



Detailed expertise on all upcoming legal requirements of IMO and EU can be provided to GSRs' clients due to GSRs' detailed involvement in legal and technical development of HKC and all related guidelines since 2005. Additionally its involvement in the preparation of the ISO 30000 series from the very beginning included also project leadership for ISO 30003 and 30005.
